### INTRODUCTION

Biodiversity encompases the variety of all life on earth. India is one of the 12 mega-diverse countries of the world. With only 2.5% of the land area, India already accounts for 7.8% of the global recorded species. India is also rich in traditional and indigeneous knowledge, both coded and informal.

India is a Party to the Convention on Biological Diversity (1992) whose main objectives are: a) Conservation of biological diversity, b) Sustainable use of its components, c) Fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising out of utilization of genetic resources.

Recognizing the sovereign rights of States to use their own biological resources, the Convention expects the Parties to facilitate access to genetic resources by other Parties subject to top national legislation and on mutually agreed upon terms (Article 3 and 15 of CBD). Article 8(j) of the Convention on Biological Diversity recognizes contributions of local and indigeneous communities to the conservation and sustainable utilization of biological resources through traditional knowledge, practices and innovations and provides for equitable sharing of benefits with such people arising from the utilization of their knowledge, practices and innovations.

Biodiversity is a multi-disciplinary subject involving diverse activities and actions. The stakeholders in biological diversity include the Central Government, State Governments institutions of local self-governmental organizations, industry, etc. One of the major challenges before India lies in adopting an instrument, which helps realize the objectives of equitable sharing of benefits enshrined in the Convention on Biological Diversity.

After extensive and intensive an consultation process involving the stakeholders, the Central Government has brought a legislation through the Biological Diversity Act, 2002, with the following salient features:- i. To regulate access to biological arising our of the use of biological resources; and associated knowledge relating to biological resources; ii. To conserve and sustainably use biological diversity; iii. To respect and protect knowledge of local communities related to biodiversity; iv. To secure sharing of benefits with local people as conservers of biological resources and holders of knowledge and information relating to the use of biological



resources; v. Conservation and development of areas of importance from the standpoint of biological diversity by declaring them as biological diversity heritage sites; vi. Protection and

rehabilitation of threatened species; vii. Involvement of institutions of state government in the broad scheme of the implementation of the Biological Diversity Act through constitution of committees.

The National Biodiversity Authority primarily addresses the issue concerning access to genetic resources and associated knowledge by foreign individuals, institutions or companies and equitable sharing of benefits arising out of the use of these resources and knowledge to the country and the people.

The National Biodiversity Authority primarily deals with matters relating to requests for access by foreign individuals, institutions or companies and all matters relating to transfer of results of research to any foreigner; imposition of terms and conditions to secure equitable sharing of benefits and approval for seeking any form of Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs) in or outside India for an invention based on research or information pertaining to a biological resource obtained

from India. The National Biodiversity Authority also facilitates to set up Biodiversity Funds at Central, State and local levels. The monetary benefits, fees and royalties received as a result of approvals by the National Biodiversity Authority will be deposited in National Biodiversity Fund. This Fund will be used for conservation and development of areas from where resources have been accessed. Keeping this in view, the National Biodiversity Authority was set up at Chennai in July 2003.

**Shri Vishwanath Anand**, Vice-Chairperson, National Environment Appellate Authority has assumed charge as **Chairperson** of the National Biodiversity Authority on afternoon of 15<sup>th</sup> July, 2003.







### d) WORK COMPLETED TILL MARCH 2004.

1. Lease agreement for hiring the Office building for NBA was made with the approval of the Chairman, NBA and the NBA took possession of the premises to set up the NBA office on 1<sup>st</sup> Aug 2003.

- 2. Opening of Bank Account in the favour of NBA was made in the BANK OF MAHARASTRA, Neelankarai Branch, Chennai.
- 3. Joint Secretary MoEF visited NBA Office, Chennai on 5<sup>th</sup> Aug 2003 to discuss the setting up of office of NBA.
- 4. Budget for the year 2003-04 was proposed to run the NBA Office in consultation with the Chairman, NBA and J. S. (CS), MoEF.
- 5. Discussion was held with Joint Secretary (CS), MoEF, New Delhi to purchase the necessary items to set up the NBA office.
- 6. Order was passed for posting administrative staff for running the office of NBA on loan basis from ZSI and BSI by the MoEF, New Delhi.
- 7. Letters were written to the Directors of **ZSI & BSI** on 4.08.03 to depute administrative staff to National Biodiversity Authority, Chennai on loan basis.
- 8. Visited New Delhi on 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> August, 2003 and discussed with the Chairman, NBA and Joint Secretary, (CS) about the notification of NBA and the notification on the powers of the Chairman to set up the Authority at the earliest.
- 9. Draft notifications were prepared alongwith Dr R.K. Rai, Addl. Director, MoEF and submitted for approval to the Joint Secretary (CS) and the Law Ministry for gazette notification on 12.8.2003.

- 11. Project Manager, National Building Construction Corporation (NBCC) was contacted for interior decoration, furnishing and air-conditioning of the NBA office at Chennai and the NBCC agreed to take up the work.
- 12. Chairman, NBA visited Chennai on 21<sup>st</sup> August 2003 to inspect the office premises and held discussions with the Project Manager, NBCC for interior decoration, furnishing and air-conditioning of office.

- 16. The NBCC, Chennai were submitted a layout drawing for the interior decoration of NBA office and the Chairman, NBA approved it.

### **MINUTES OF THE METING:**

- 1. The Chairman welcomed the members and gave brief introduction about the Biodiversity Act, 2002 (**BDA**). He explained that the Ministry of Environment & Forests was following a stage by stage approach and has notified the provisions of sections 1,2, 8-7, 48, 54, 59, 62-65 of the BDA. He informed that this Section 3, 4, 5 and 6 will be brought into effect after the National Biodiversity Authority (**NBA**) is fully in place with adequate complement of staff and after preparing a well thought out methodology for processing applications including the notification of regulations by the National Biodiversity Authority in consultation with the Central Government as per Section 64 of the Act. He added that prior to this the Central Government would notify the Rules under Section 62 of the Act.
- The Member Secretary of the National Biodiversity Authority gave a comprehensive presentation on the provisions of the BDA and related International Conventions/Landmarks on Biodiversity.
- 3. Followed by the presentation on the different sections of the Biodiversity Act the members were requested to express their views on various sections.

4. All the members expressed their views on the determination of benefit sharing out of utilization of bioresources. Dr. P. Pushpangadan, Director, NBRI, Lucknow representing the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research (Shri Sudhir Kuamr JS), mentioned during the discussion that he has done the benefit sharing exercise in one of the villages in India and that can be used as example for making benefit sharing exercise in other areas of the country.

Action: Member Secretary, National Biodiversity Authority to write to Dr Pushpangadan to get the information to be used for further areas if needed.

5. Discussion was held to set up expert committees to be set up by the National Biodiversity Authority as per section 13 (1) and (2) to advise on various issues connected with and those likely to arise after full notification of the Biodiversity Act.

Action: Member Secretary, National Biodiversity Authority to prepare a list of possible nominees and sub-committees for consideration of the National Biodiversity Authority.

6. Discussions was also held about the procedures for applying for approval for biodiversity use for research by various individuals and organizations. At this context the Chairperson, National Biodiversity Authority said that, for example, if a person wants permission for using a tissue sample of snake from the Western Ghats for research, he can apply through the Chief Wildlife Warden of the Forest Department concerned. In case, another person wants to apply for transfer of microbial DNA the person can submit the application through Department of Biotechnology. Likewise if a person wants any plant or animal material for research, he should apply through the ZSI or BSI for approval. For doing so, the procedure for application for approval for research, and for transfer of results should be framed.

Action: Member Secretary, National Biodiversity Authority to prepare the application format with procedures for use of biodiversity for research purposes.

7. It was noted that as the provisions of sections 3,4,5 and 6 of the BDA are to be brought into effect at a subsequent date, the Ministry of Environment and Forests may be requested to deal with the applications so far received by the National Biodiversity Authority, as the latter is not presently legally empowered and administratively not in a position to process them

Action: Member Secretary, National Biodiversity Authority should take further action in consultation with Dr R. K. Rai Addl. Director (CS) of the Ministry of Environment and Forests (MOEF).

8. The Chairperson suggested that the existing information on the commercial biodiversity, the banned species under different acts for collection and commercial utilization, protected areas wherein the diversity is available, different manufactures in the country registered under Small Scale Industries and others, different exporters of biodiversity products, existing traditional knowledge, and the list of *vaids* and *hakims* practicing in the country may be compiled from various sources already existing in different departments and Ministries with the help of Research Scholars/Scientists on contract basis. To this effect, a proposal to collate the information in the form of a database containing all information such

as place of availability, distribution, known status of the organism, commercial use etc., may be developed and submitted for sanction.

Action: Member Secretary, National Biodiversity Authority may prepare a proposal to this effect and execute the work within one year of the acceptance of the proposal.

9. Some members suggested that in the notification constituting the National Biodiversity Authority, the word "Joint Secretary" of the Ministry concerned has been used. As all the Ministries/Departments do not have the post of Joint Secretaries dealing with the subject of biodiversity, the word could be amended as "Joint Secretary/Equivalent".

Action: Member Secretary may take up this case with Dr R. K. Rai, Ministry of Environment & Forests.

- 10. Member Secretary of NBA indicated that at present, there was no staff for the NBA office as those deputed by the Ministry of Environment & Forests have not joined from their parent organizations. The National Biodiversity Authority noted that wherever necessary the Member Secretary may, with prior approval of the Chairman, engage suitably qualified personnel on a short term contract basis on the same terms and conditions as applicable to Government Ministries/Departments. The representative of the Ministry of Environment & Forests informed that the issue of deputation of staff joining the National Biodiversity Authority would be pursued at the earliest.
- 11. The meeting ended with thanks to the Chair.




Sea anemone and clown fish of ornamental importance: Gulf of Mannar





### MODULE IV: COMMERCIALLY IMPORTANT FAUNA OF INDIA




